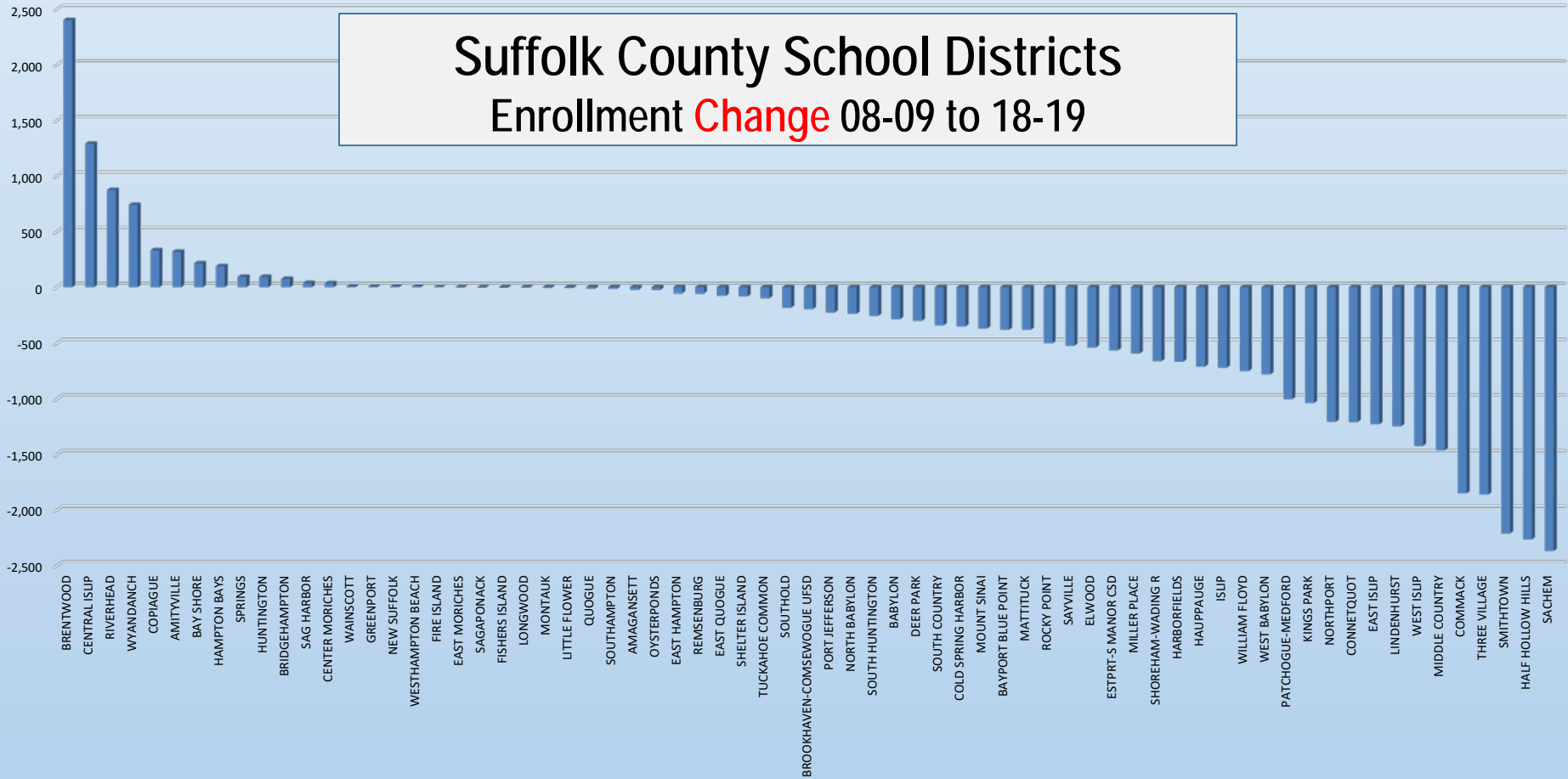

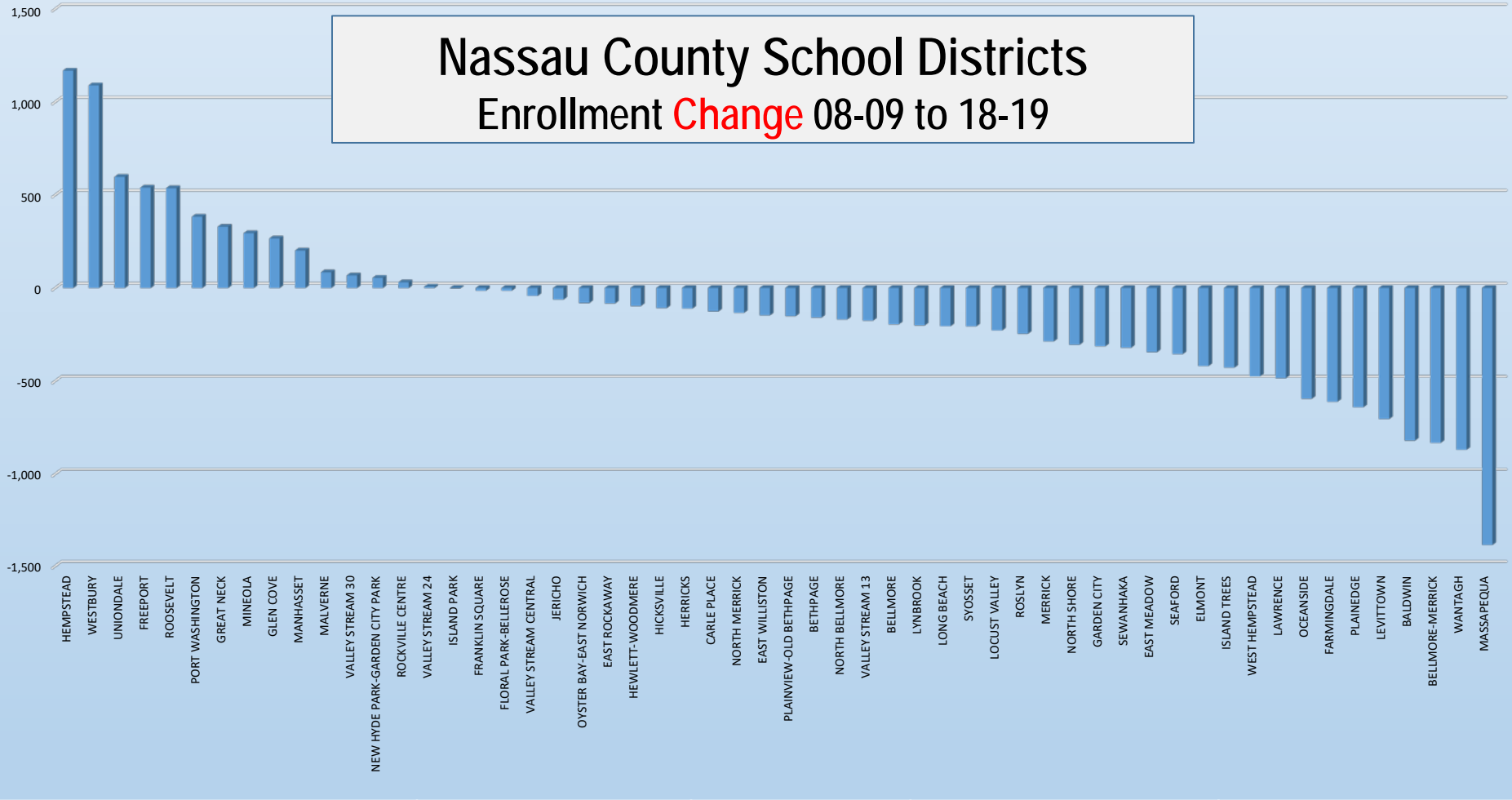

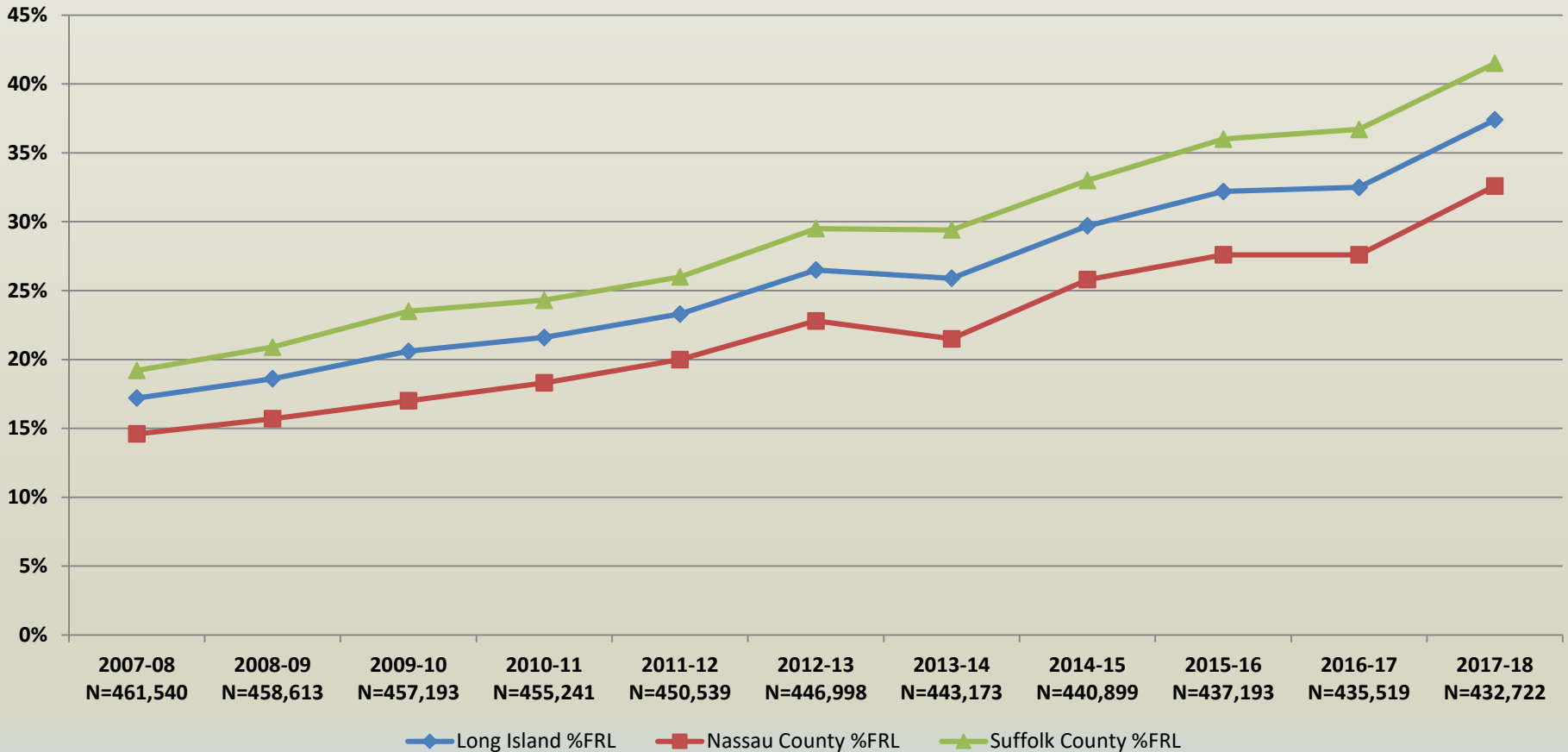

% of Free/Reduced Lunch Students on Long Island



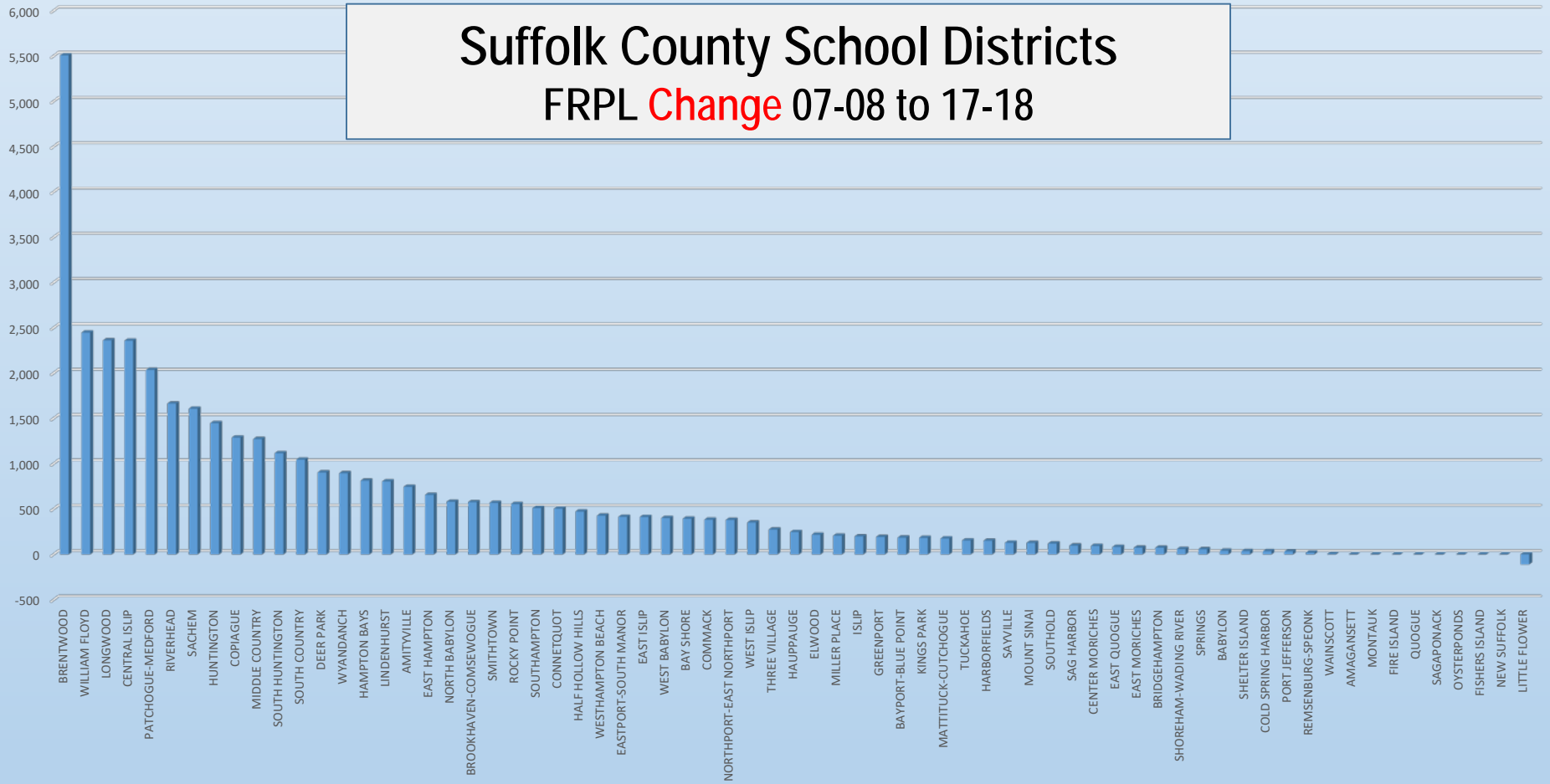

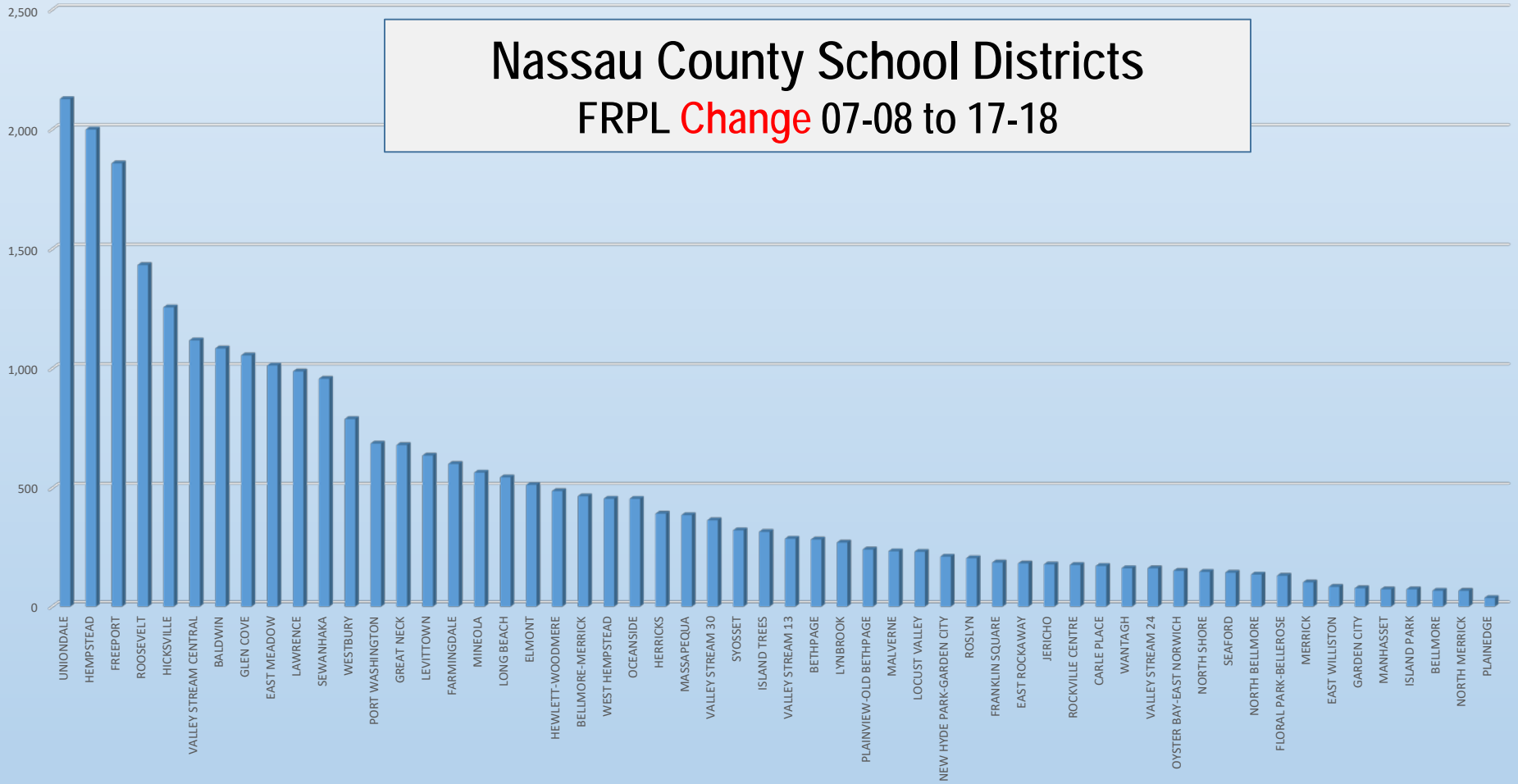

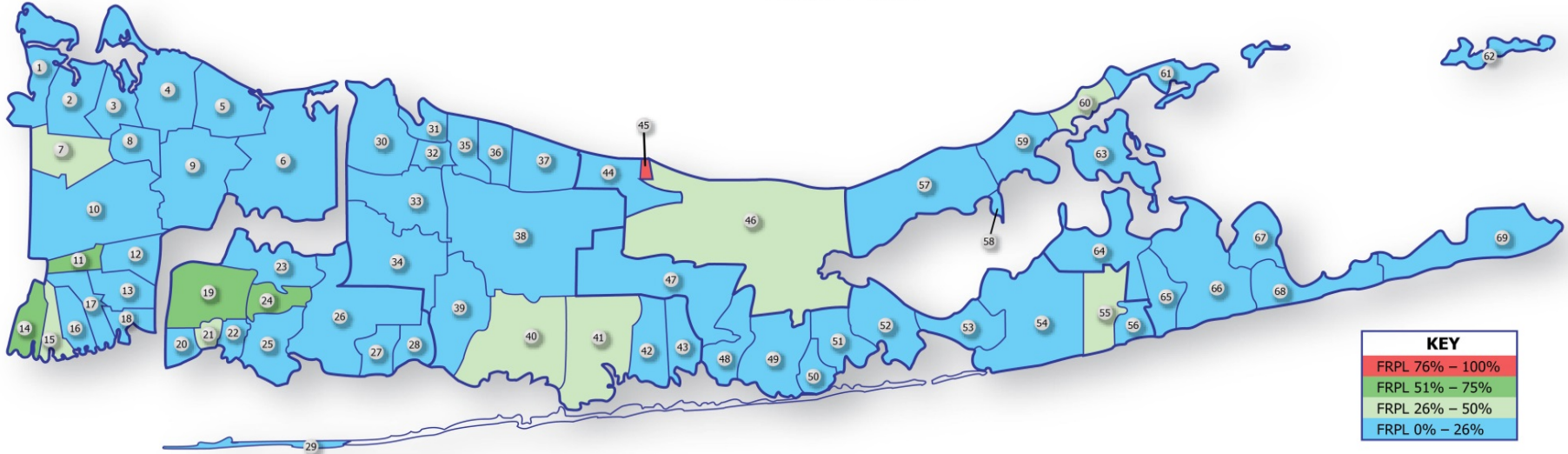

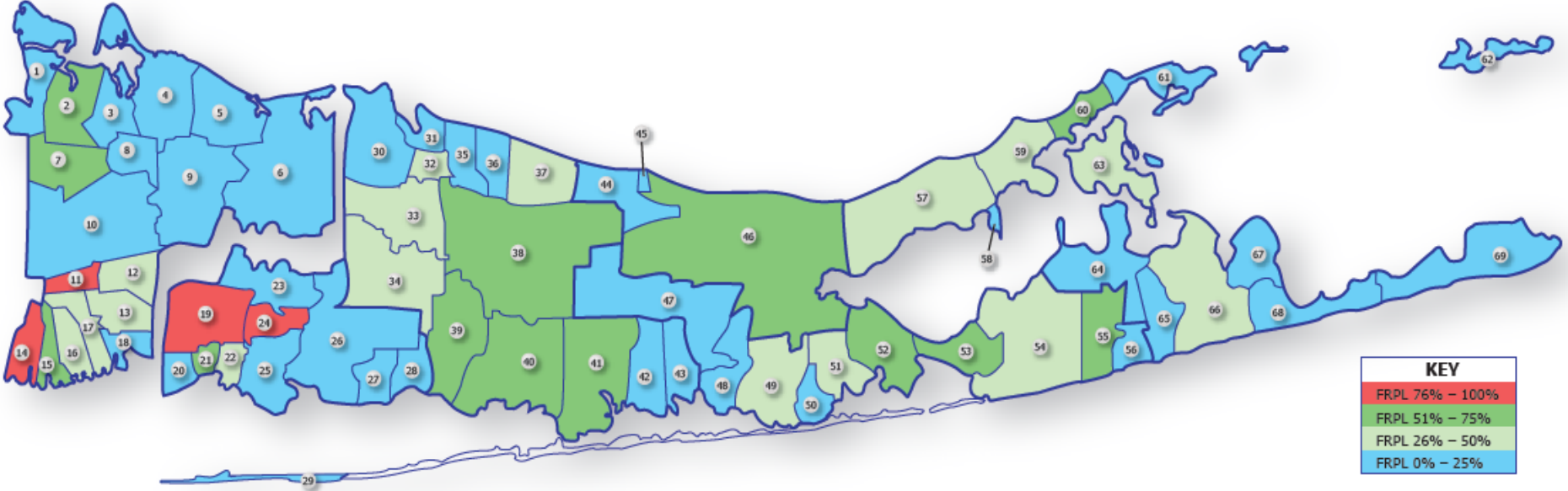

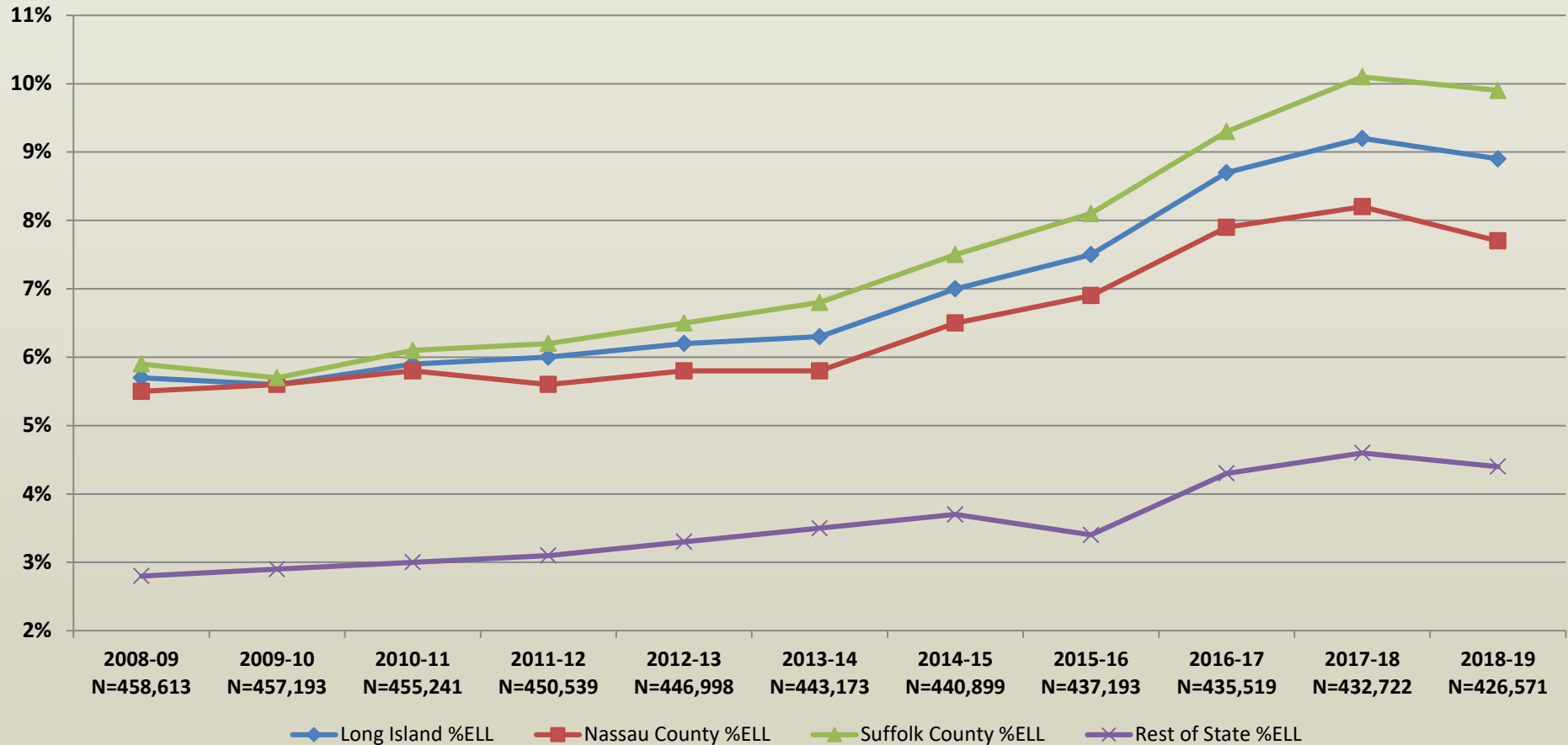

% of ELL Students on Long Island



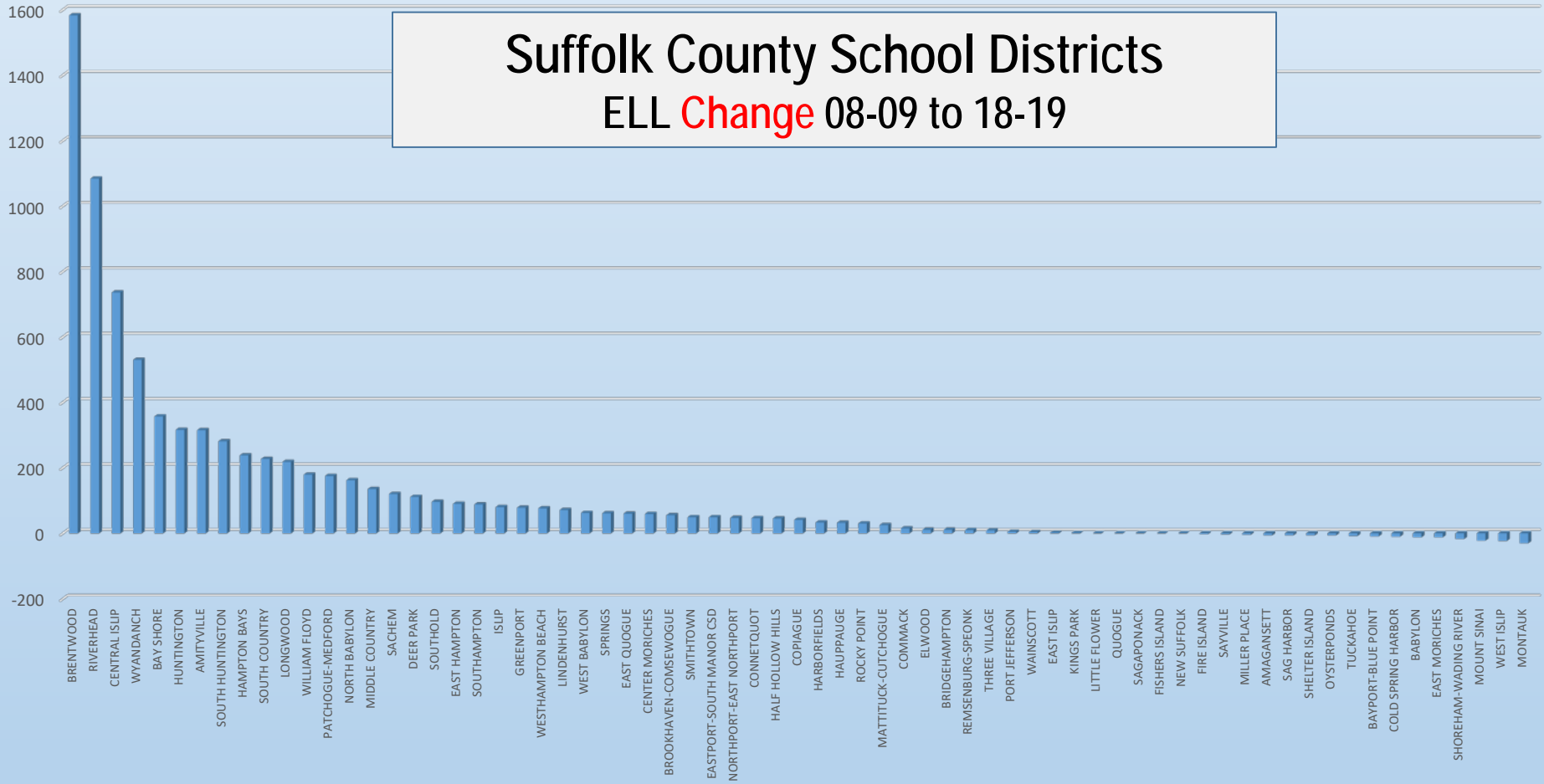

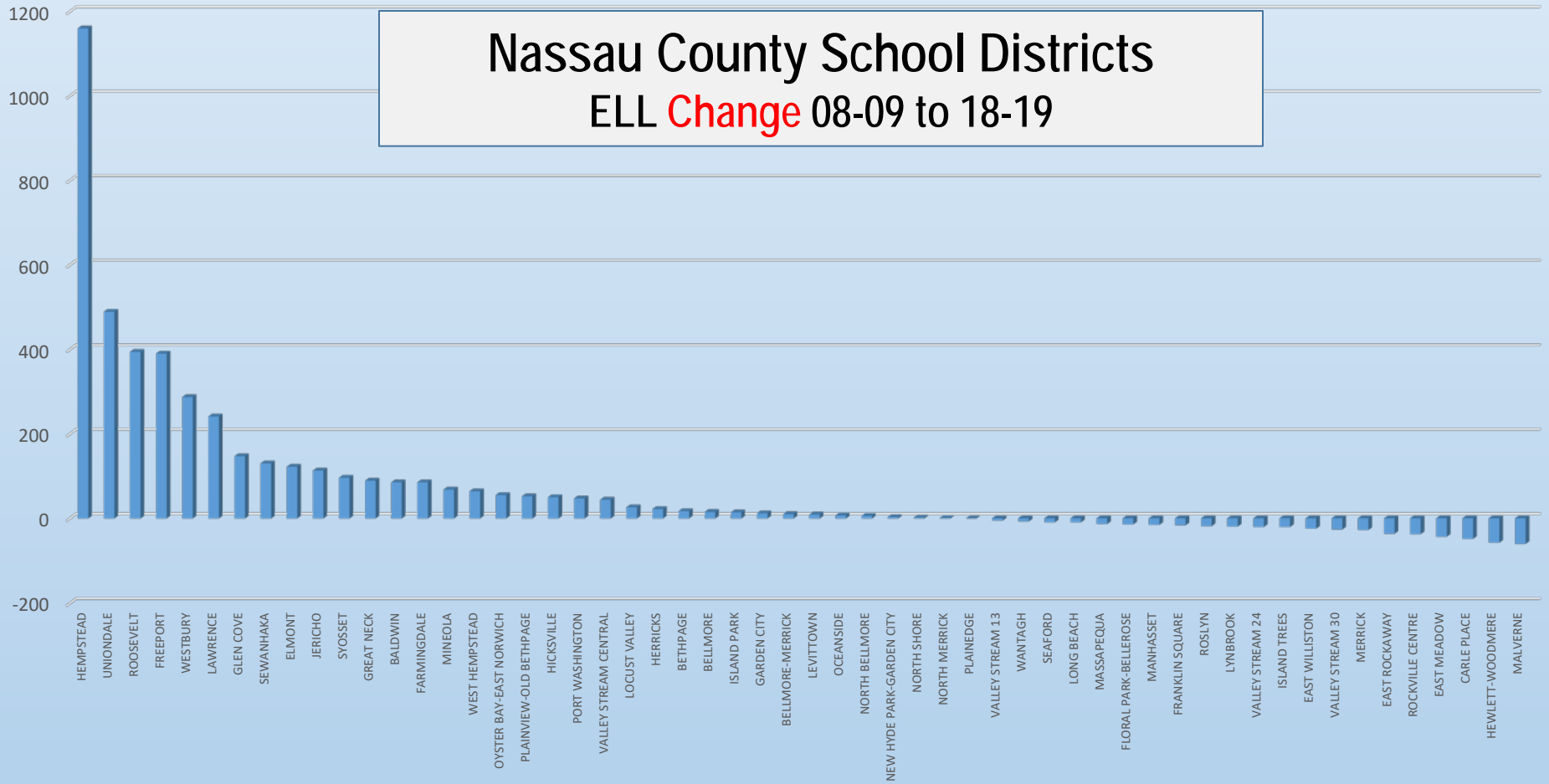

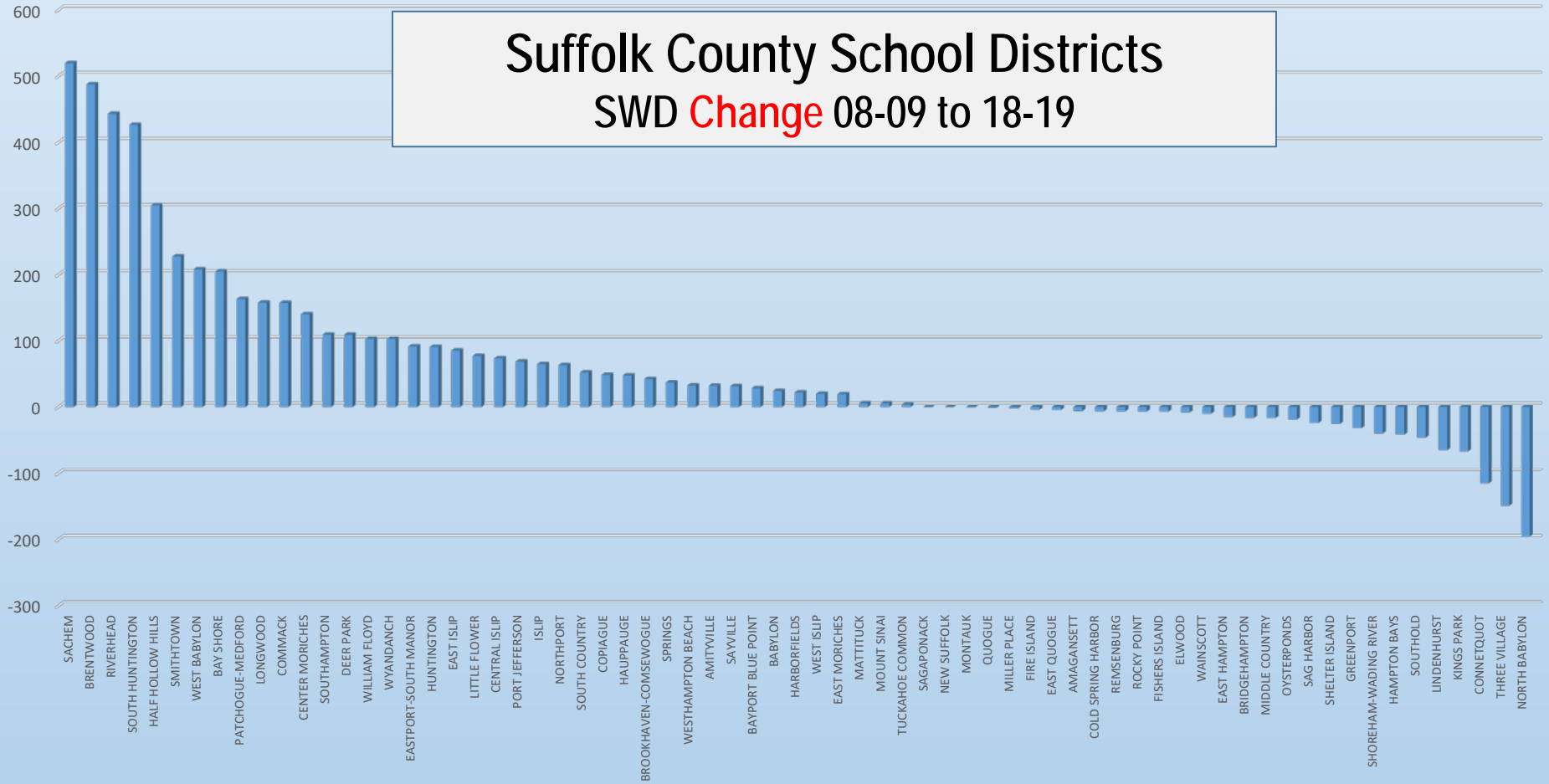

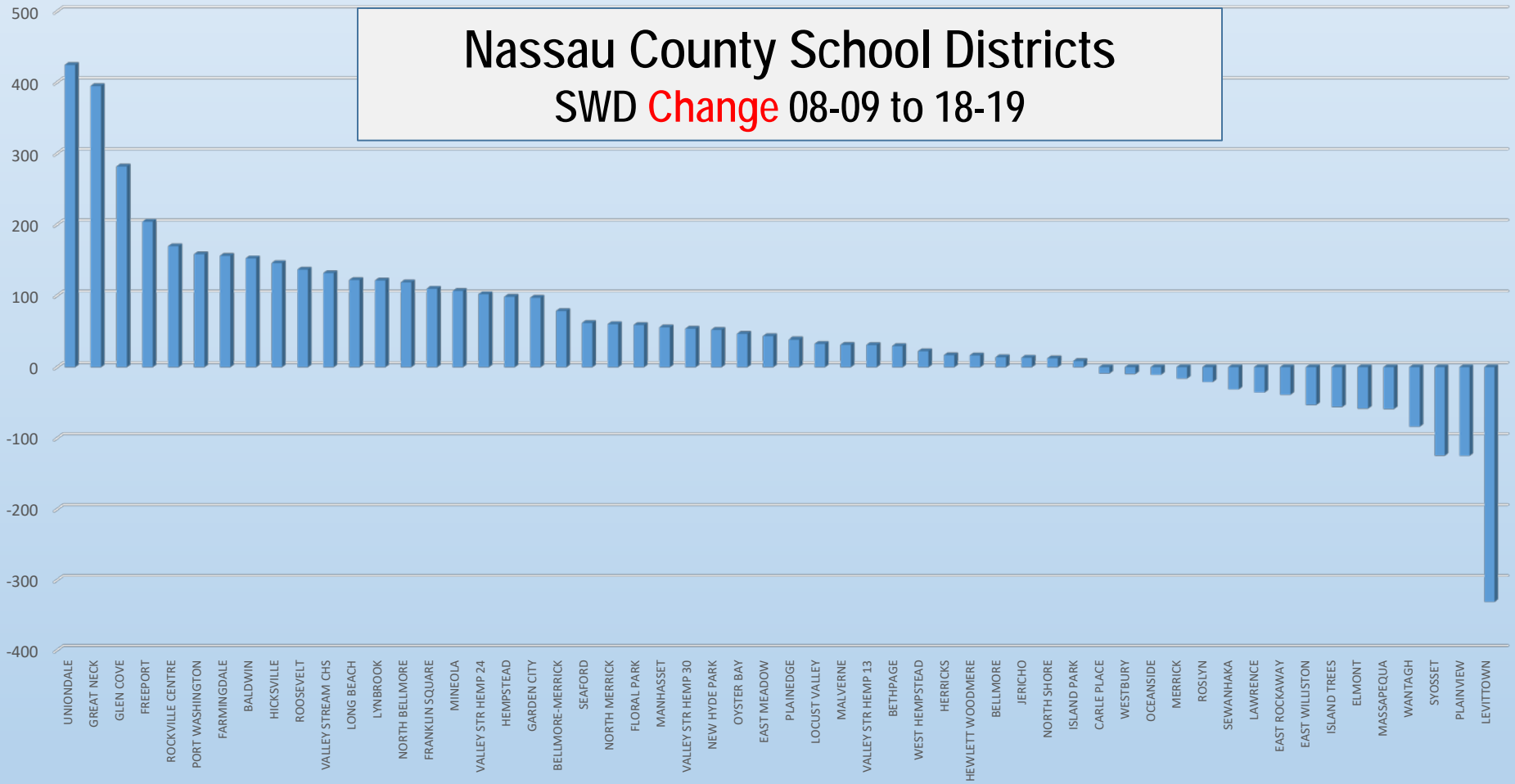

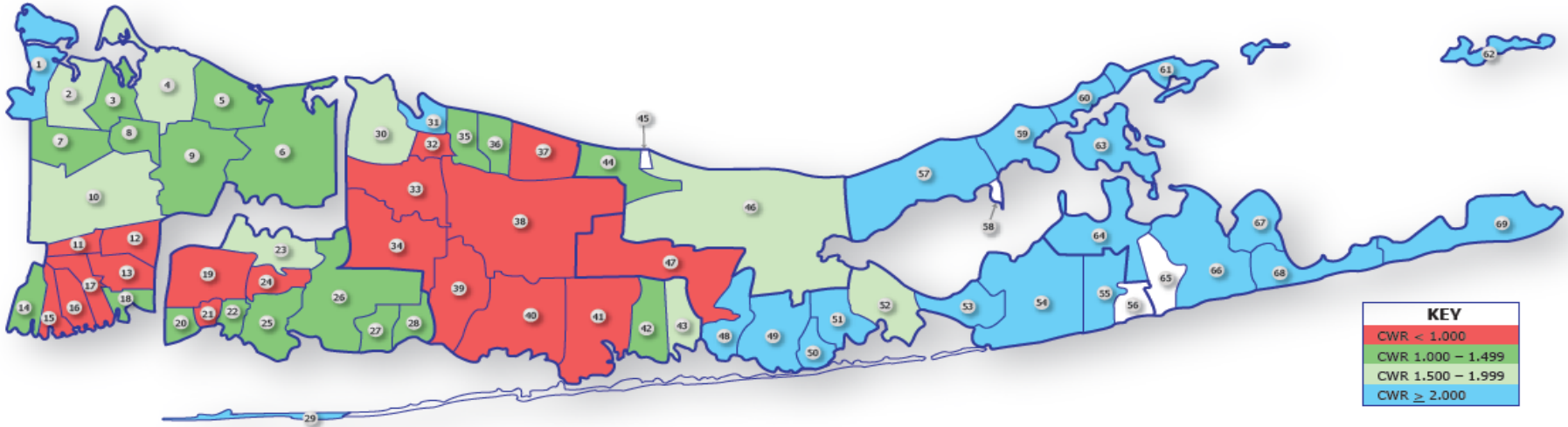

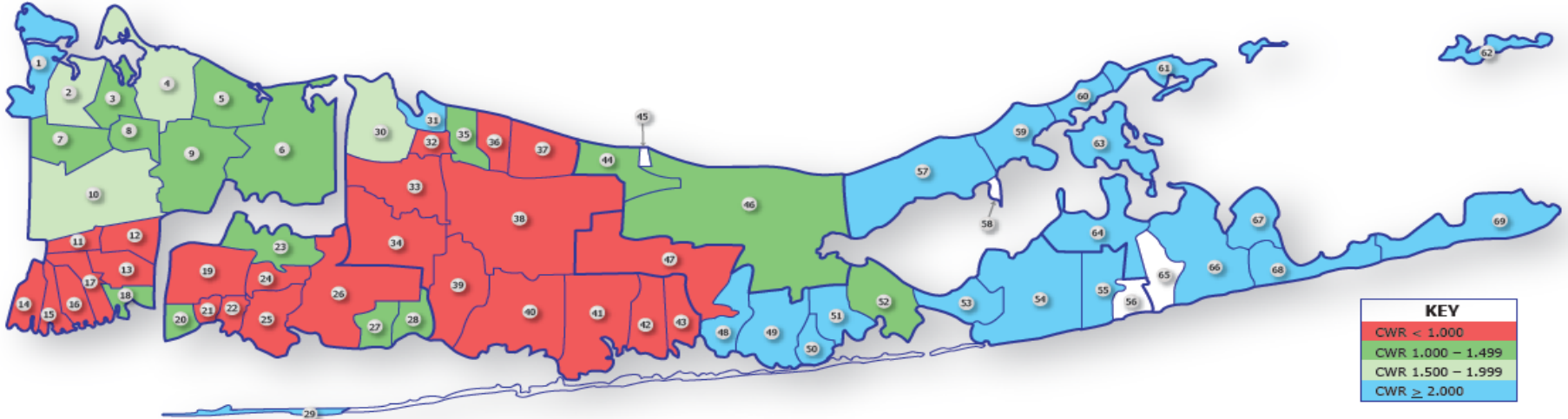

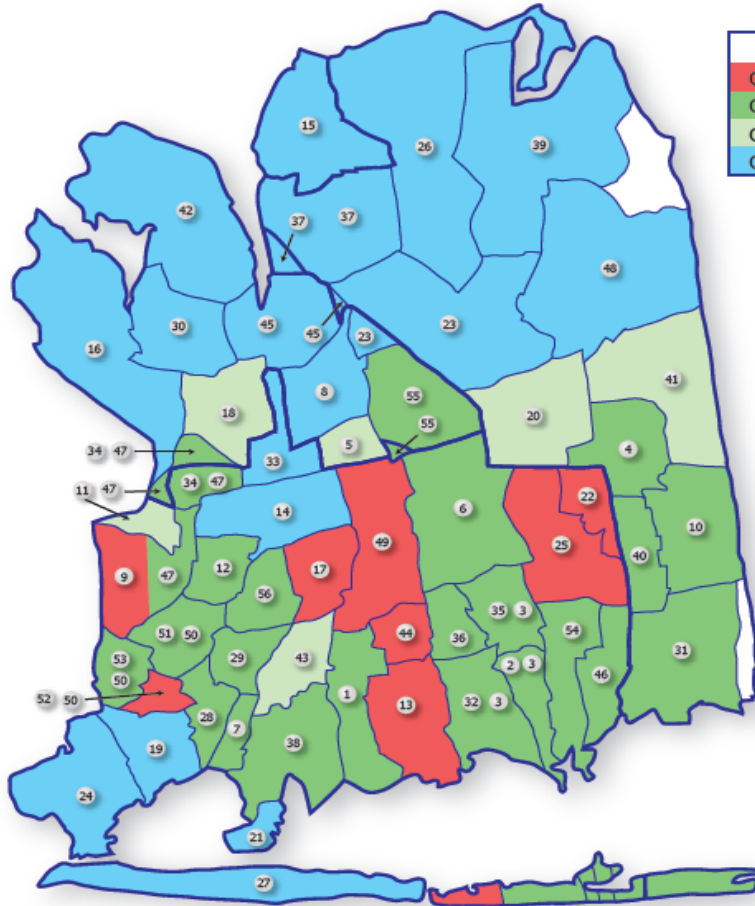

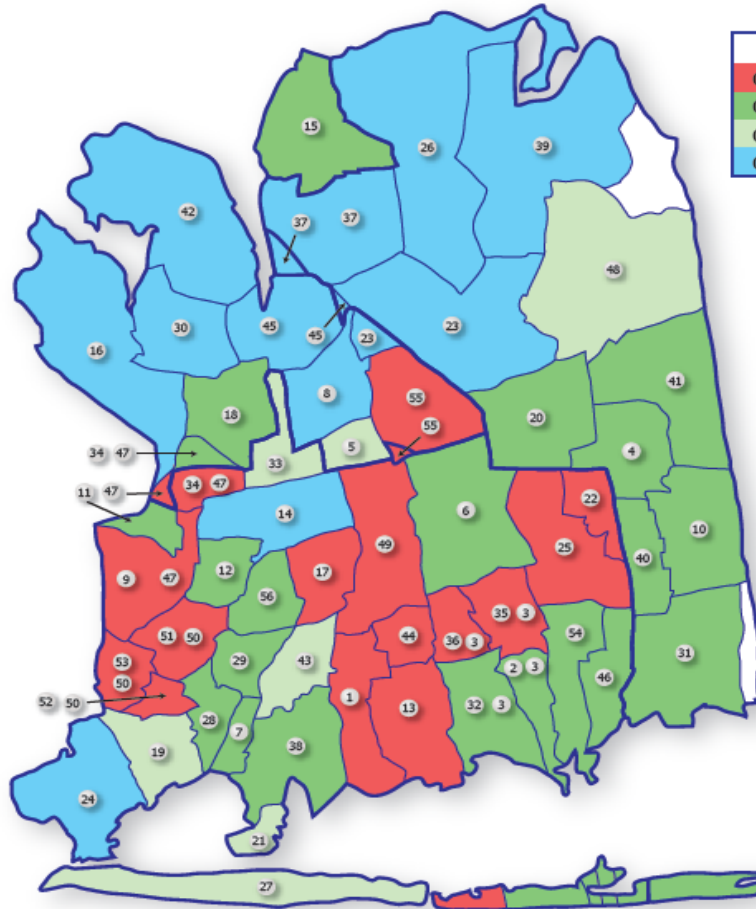

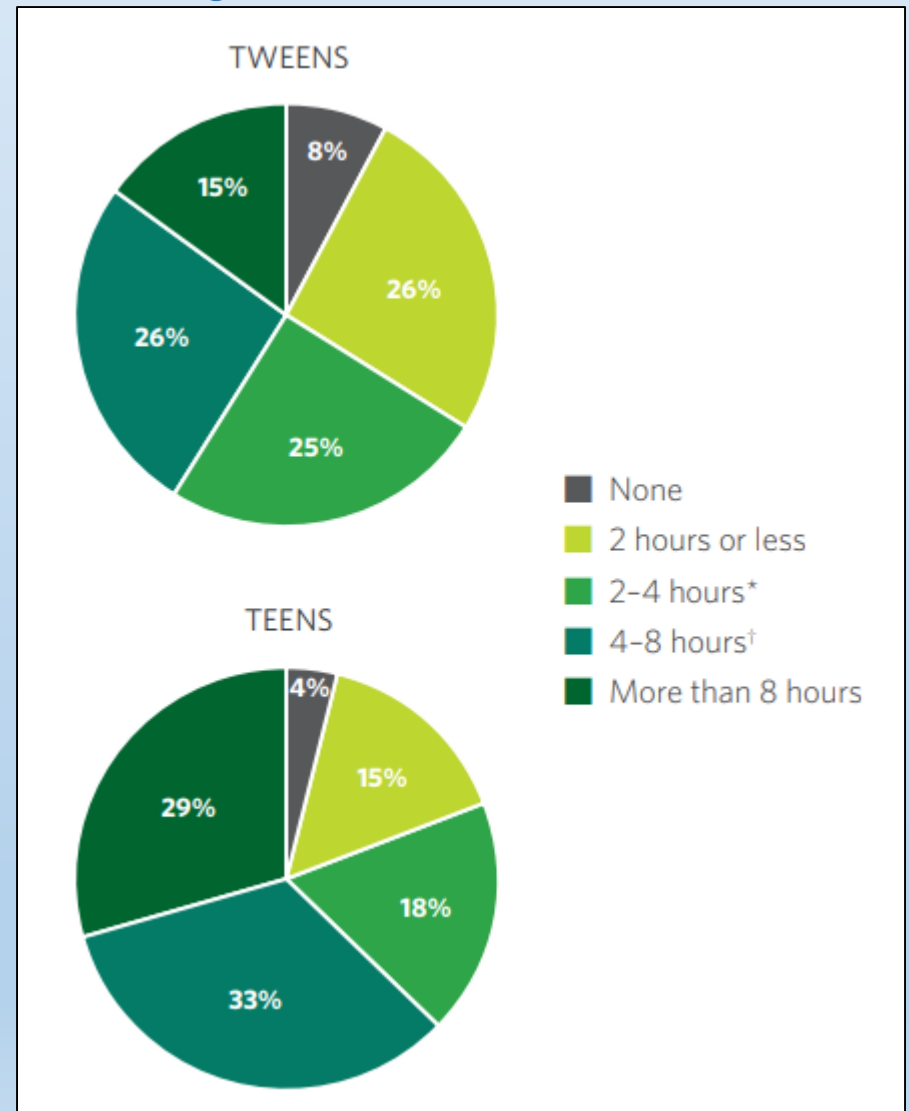

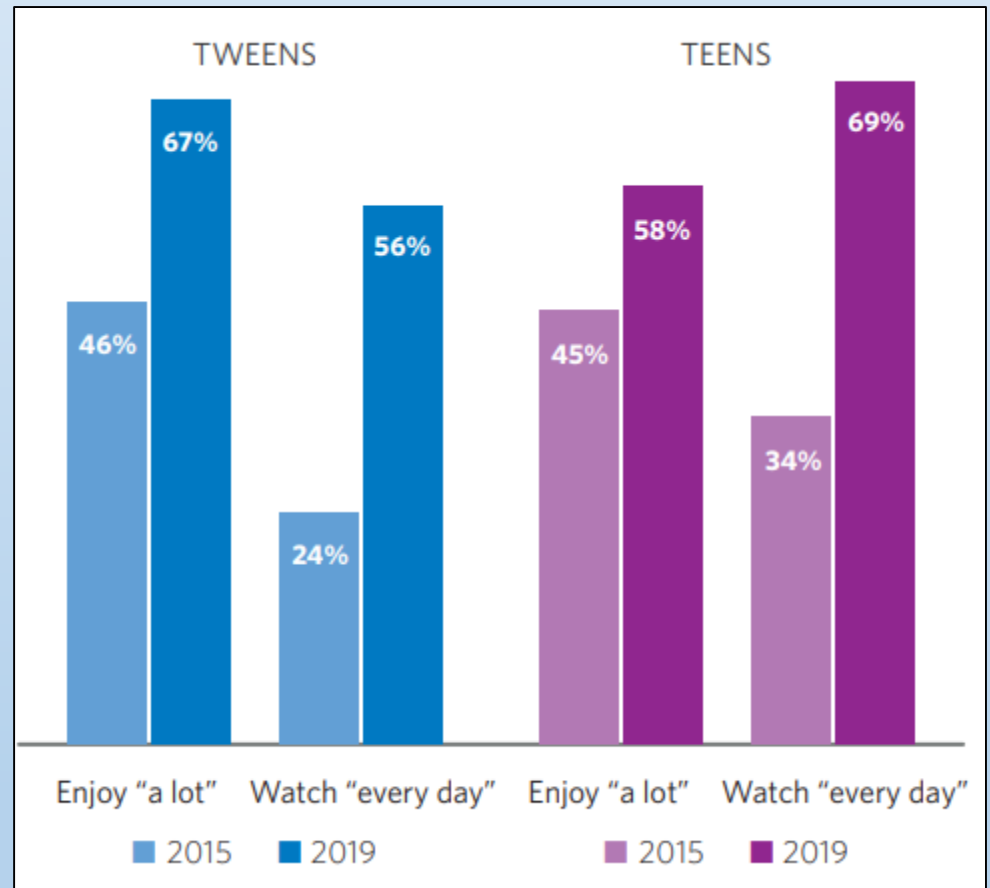


Online Video Viewing: Frequency & Enjoyment

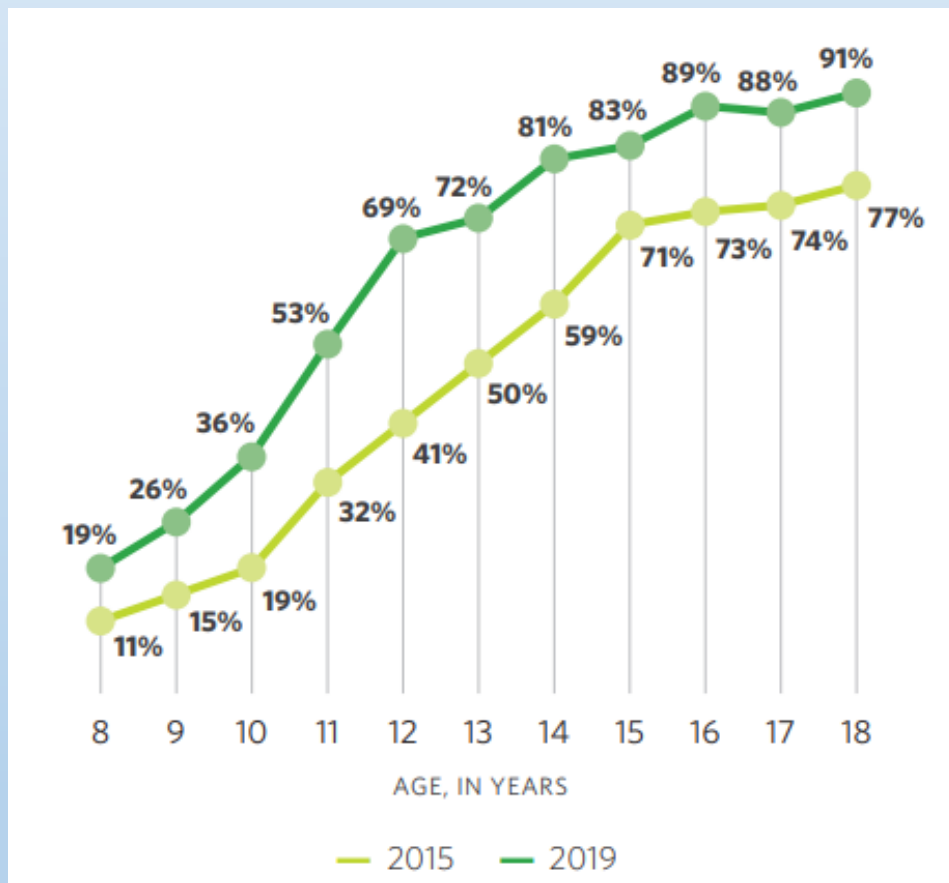

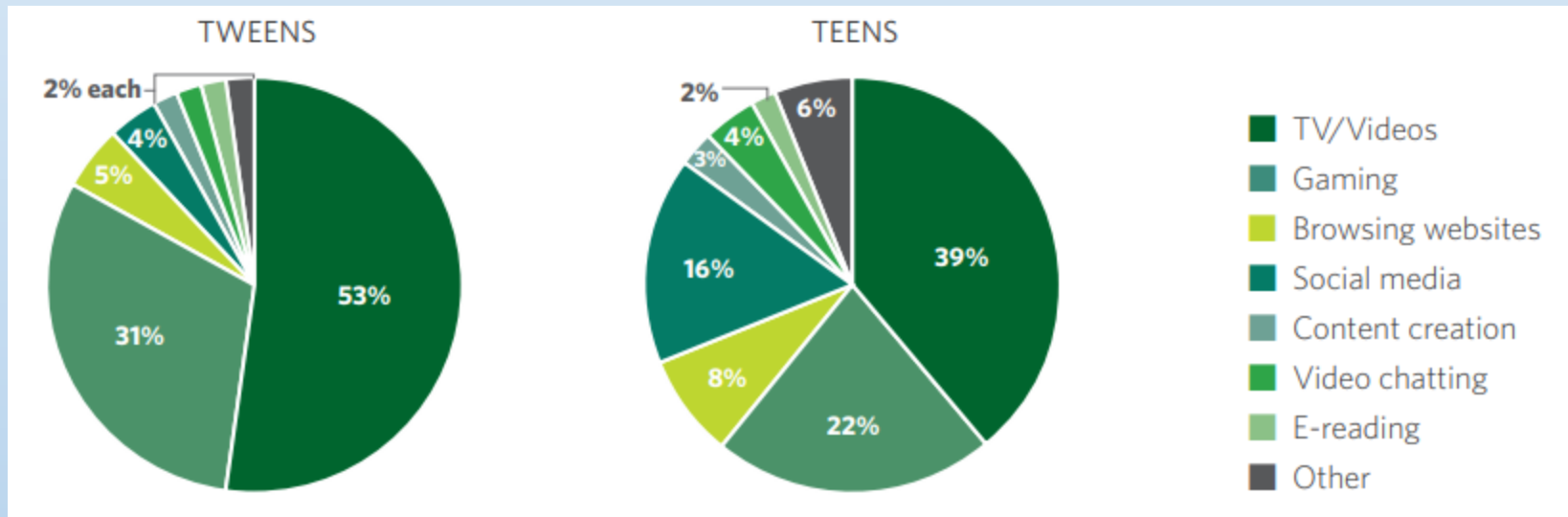
Smartphone Ownership

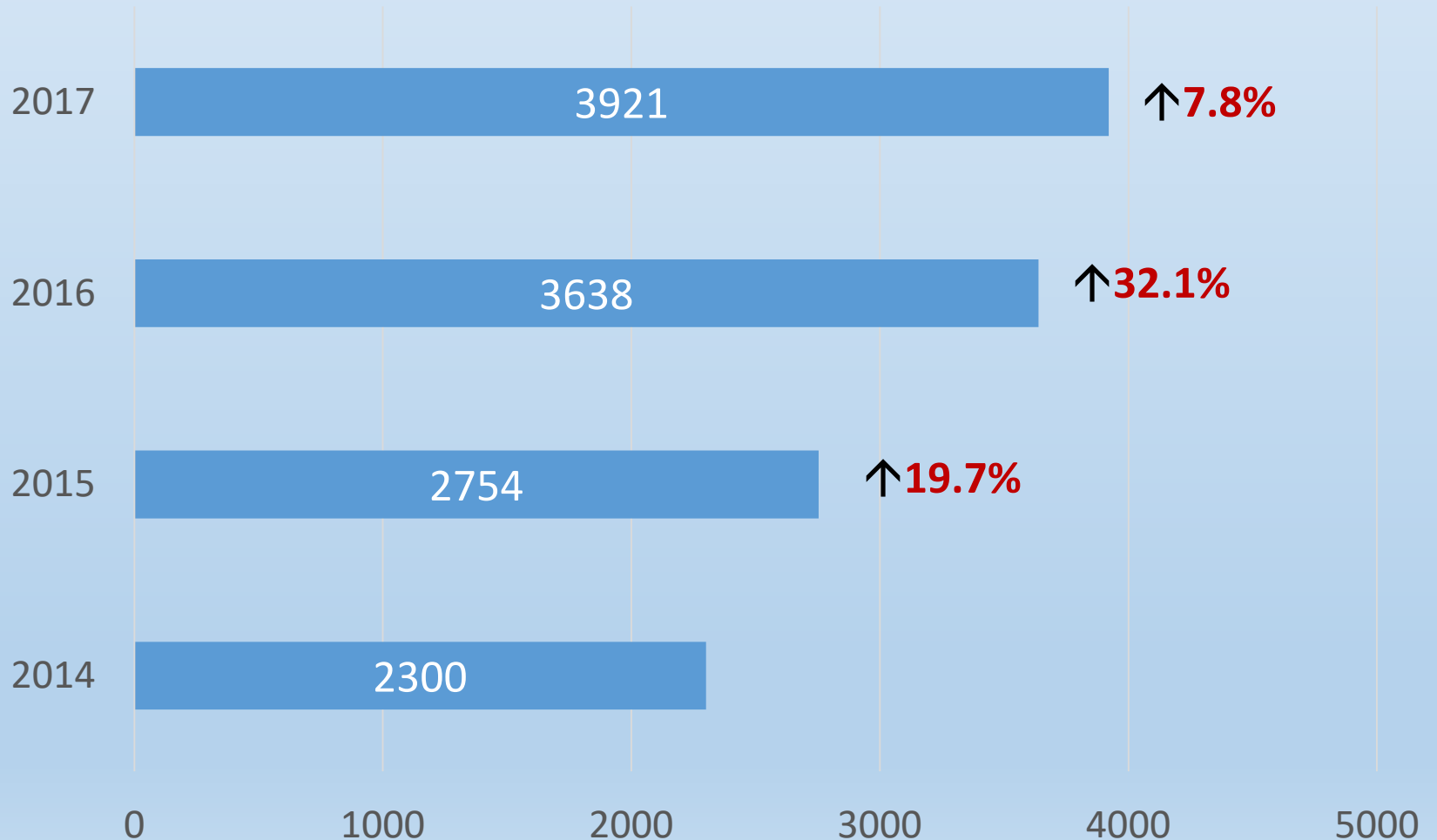

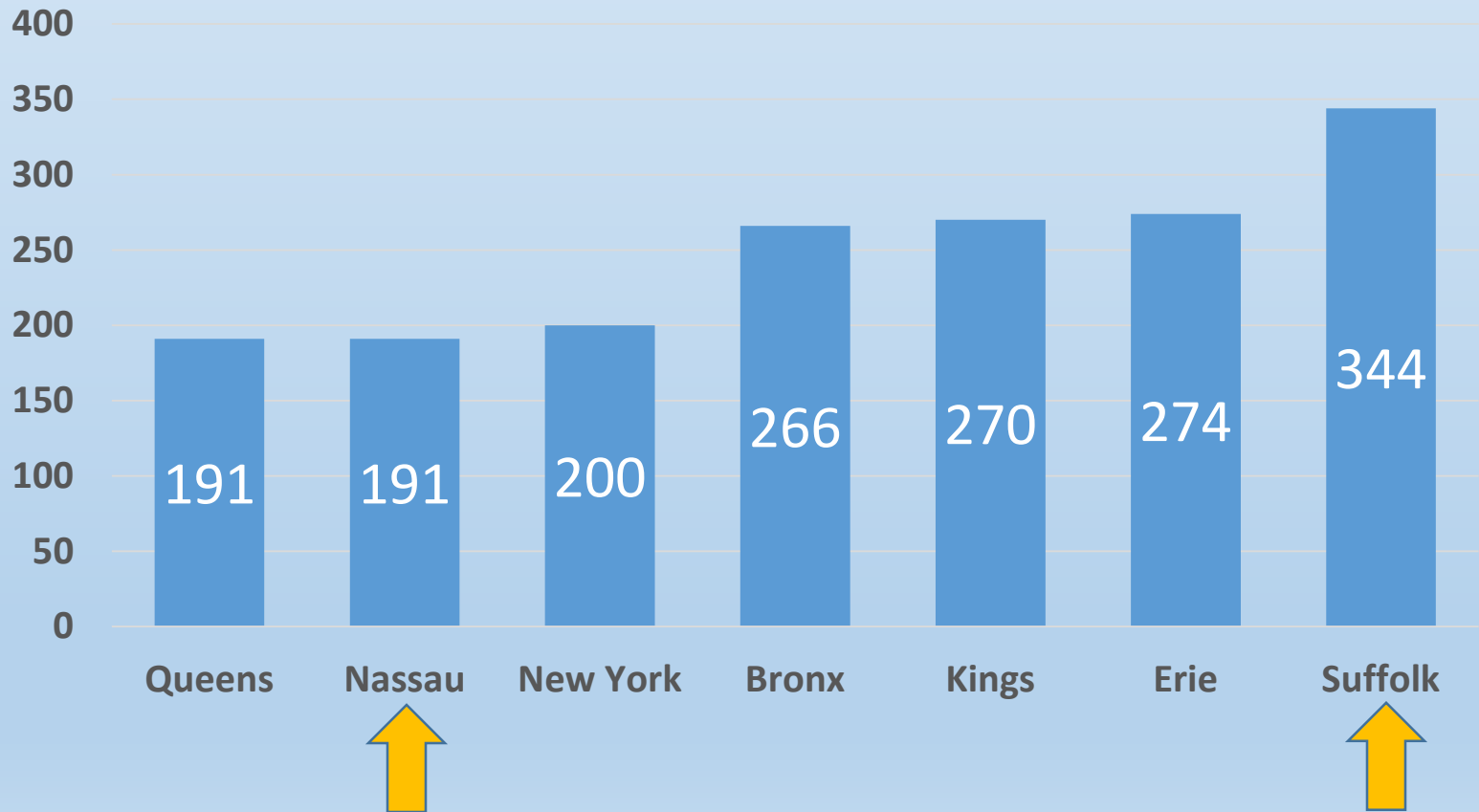
The Drug Overdose Mortality Increase New York State

New York State Counties Highest Number of Deaths Involving Drugs

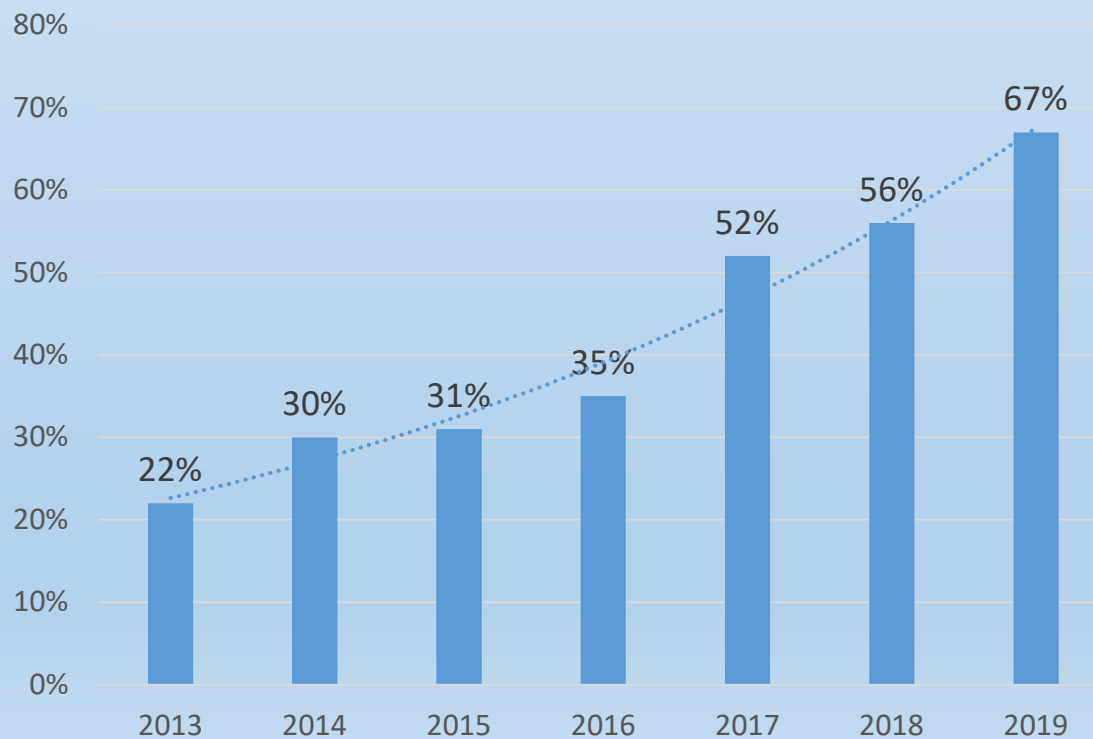

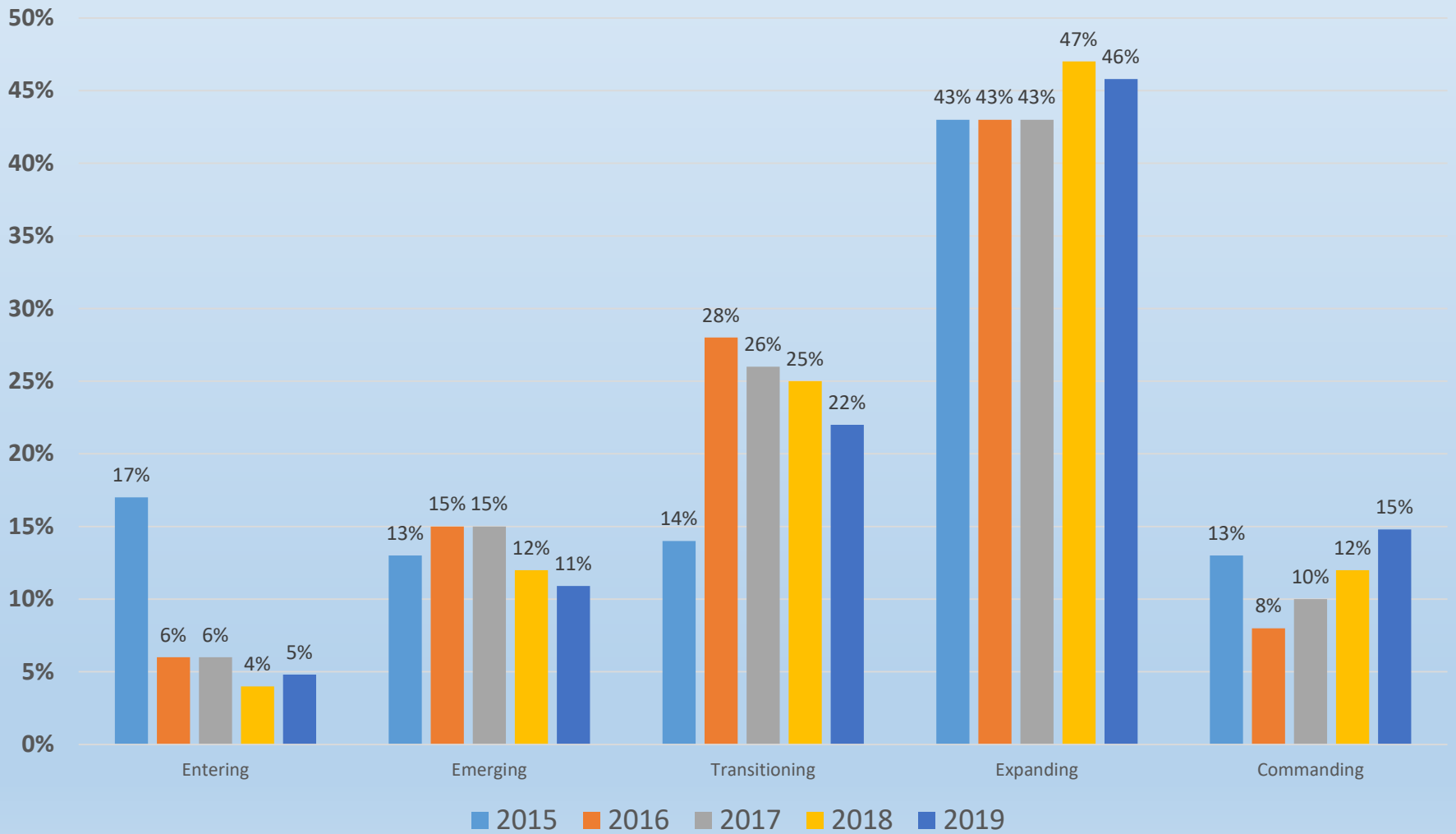

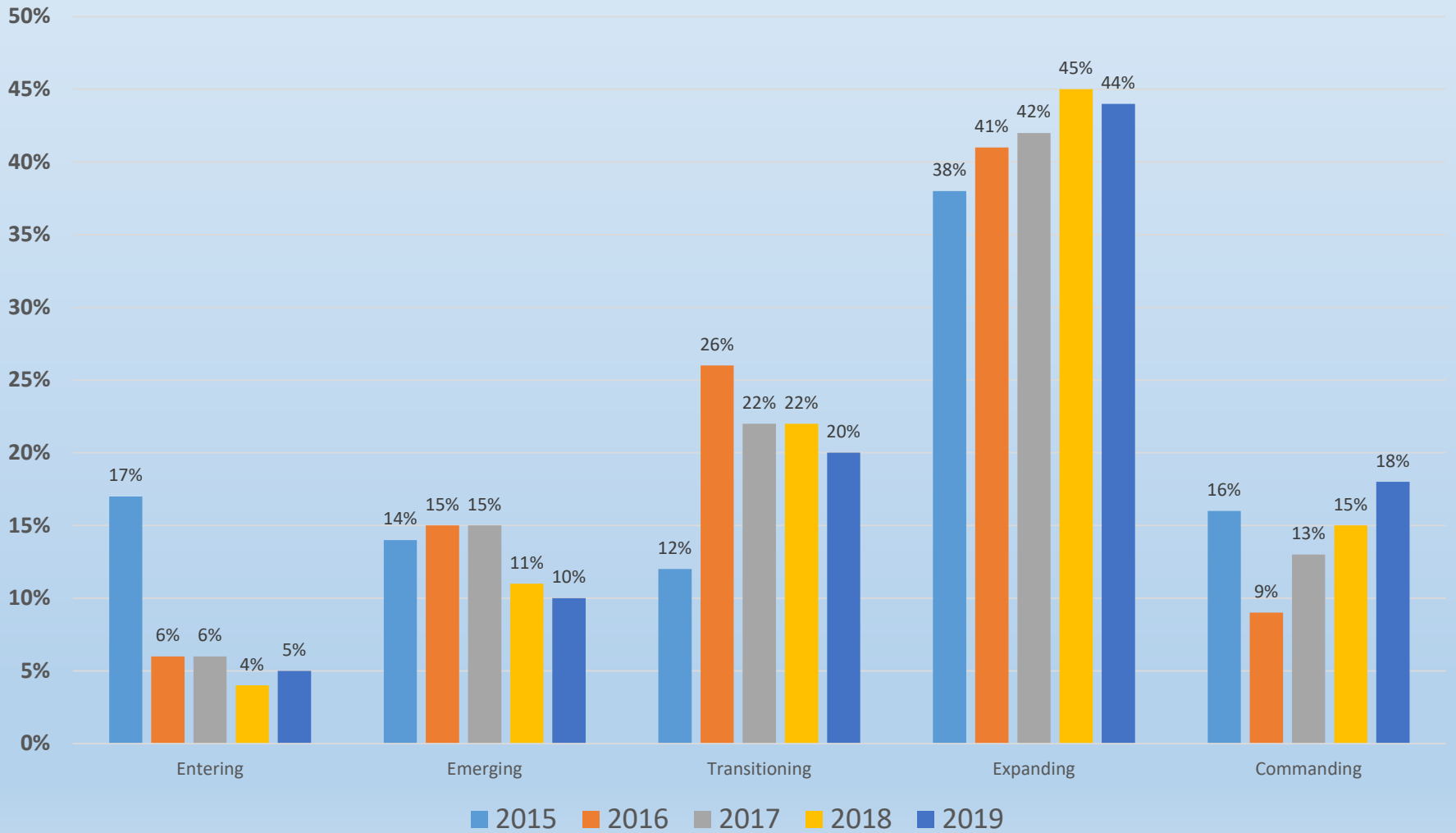

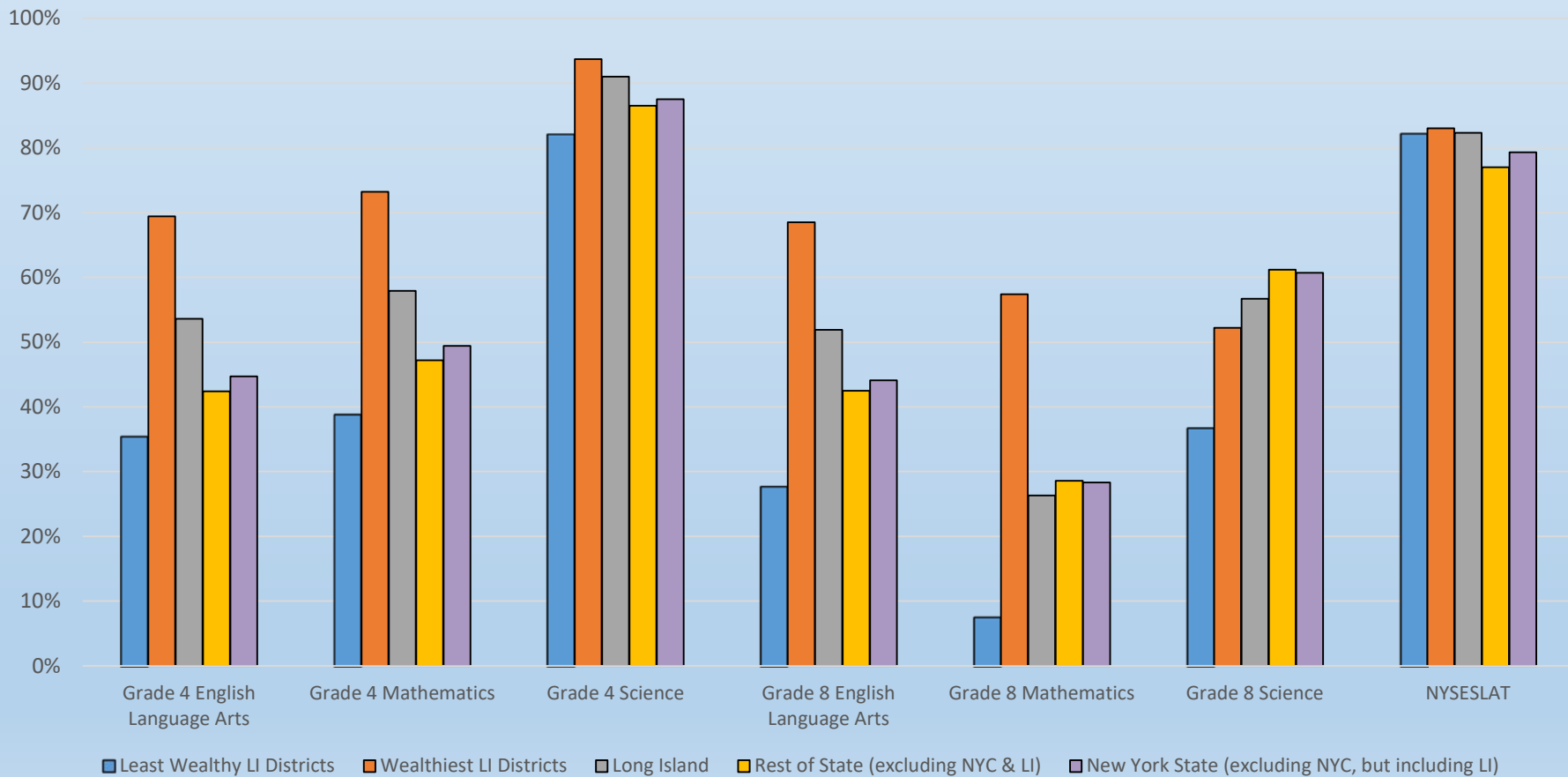

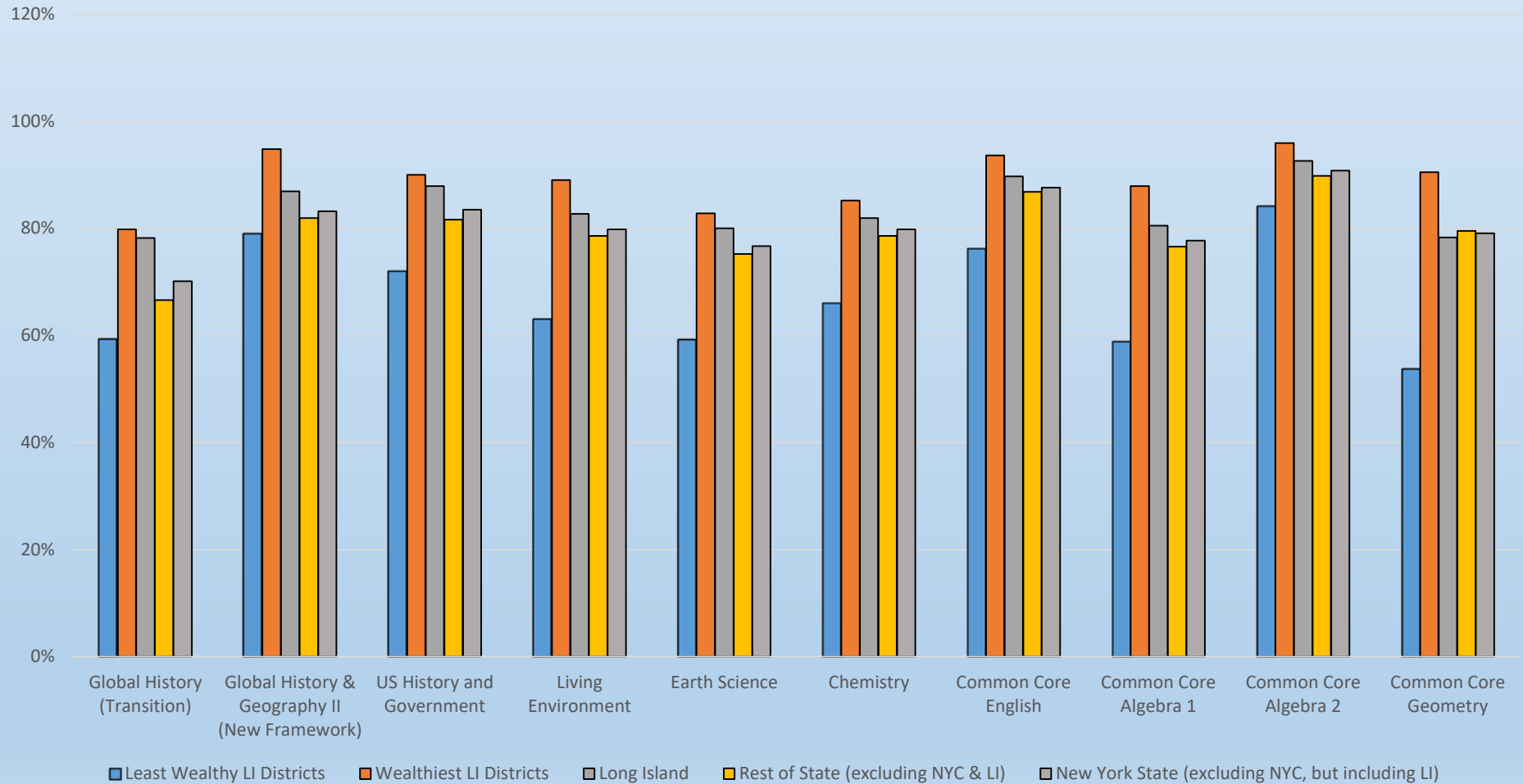

Percentage of Students in Long Island's Least Wealthy and Wealthiest School Districts Passing the Regents Exams in 2018-19



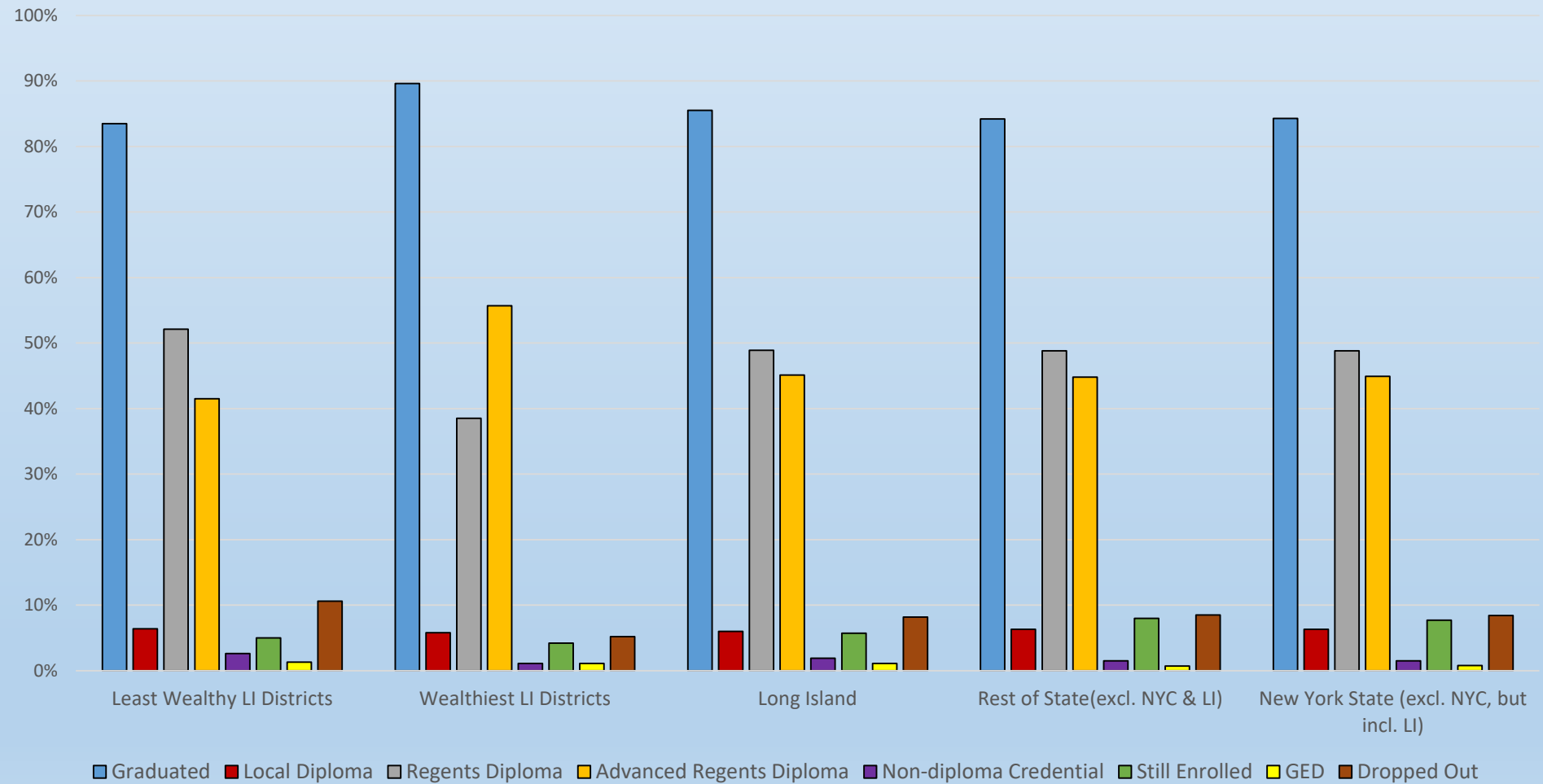

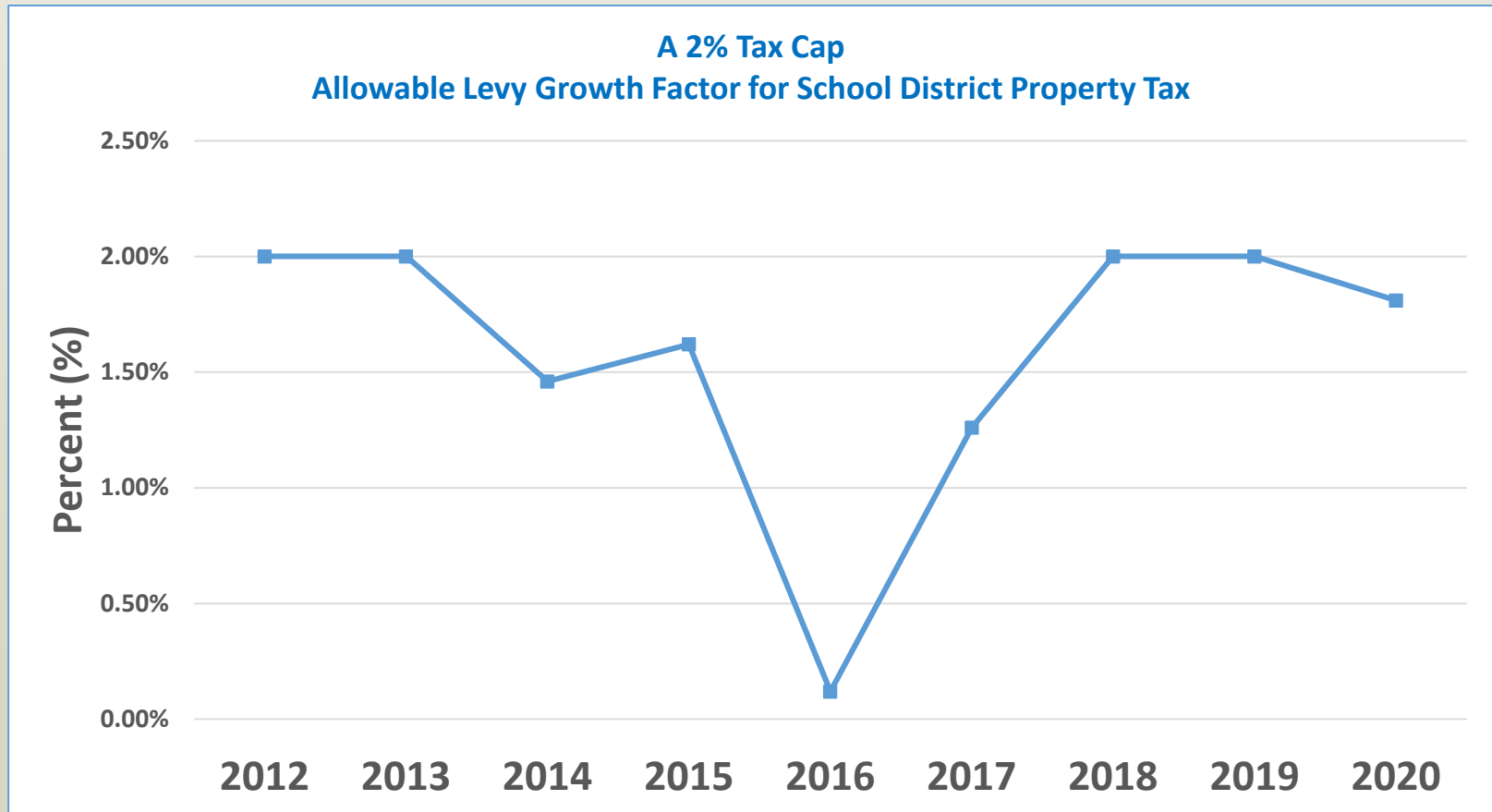

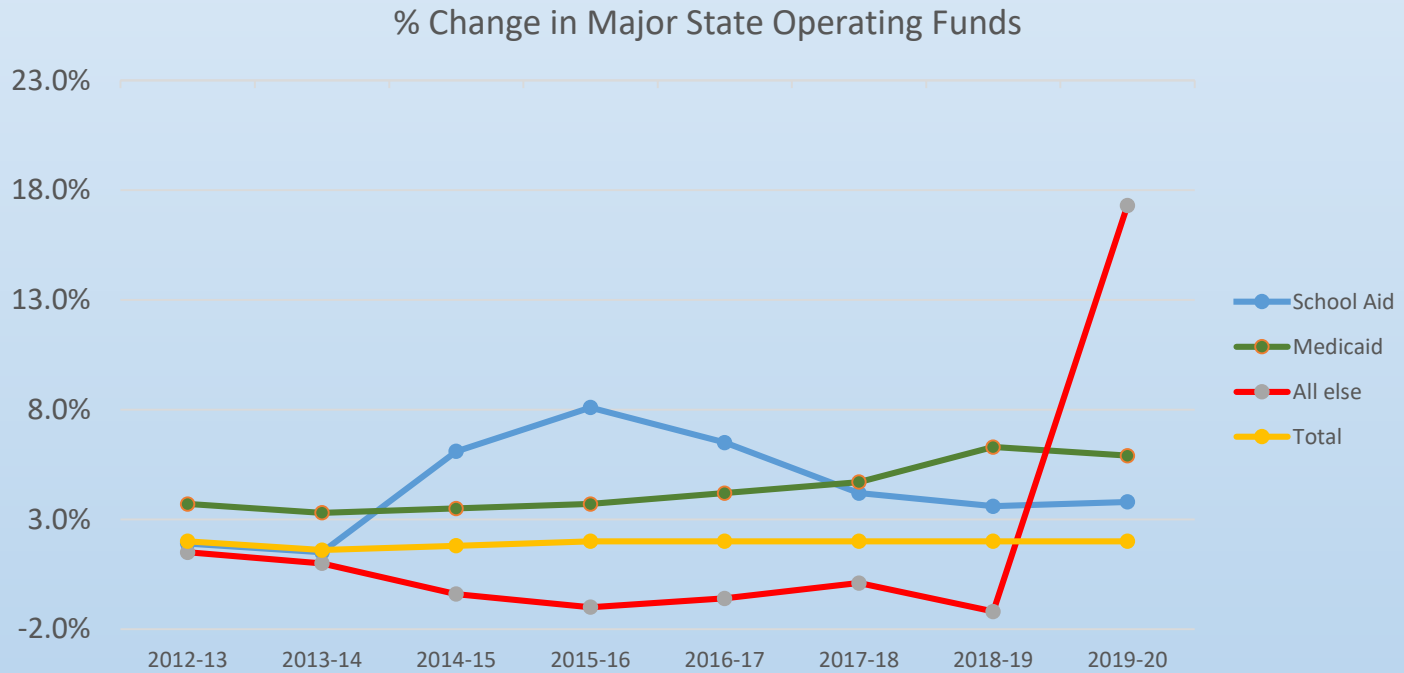
Tax Cap Since Inception

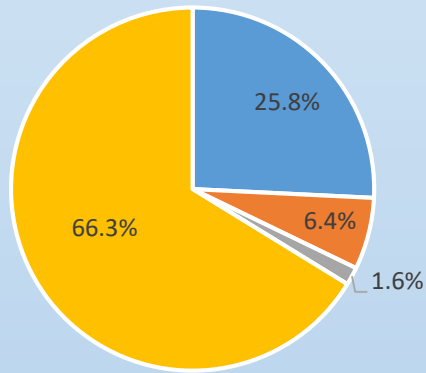

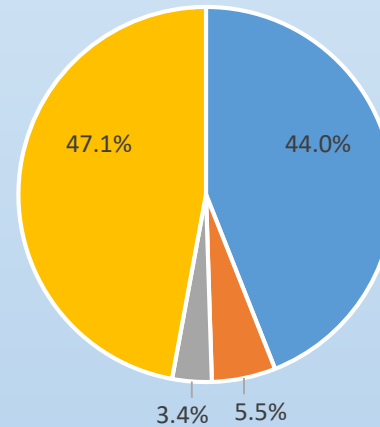

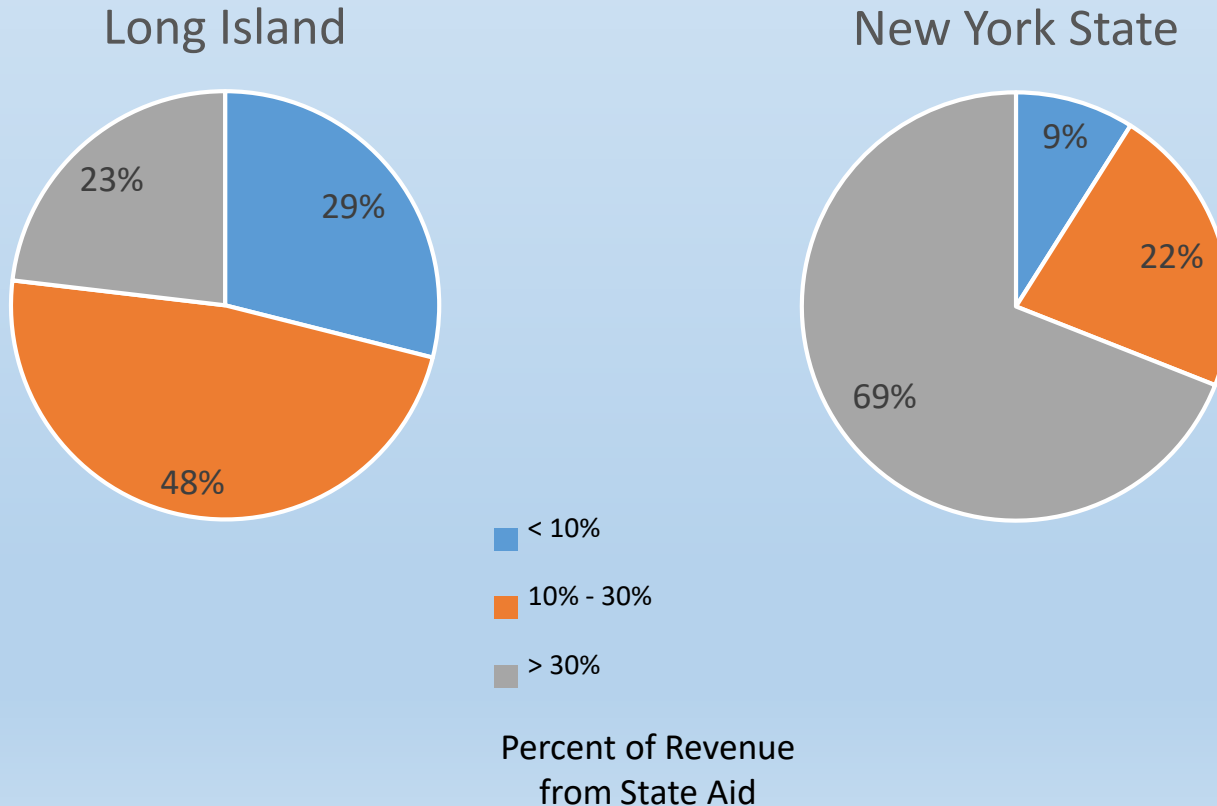
