Education Funding

- Proposed increase of \$2.07 billion (+7.1%)
 - \$1.6 billion Foundation Aid increase
 - \$471 million increase in expense-based and other categorical aids
- Foundation Aid formula phase-in: Year 2 of 3
 - 50% of remaining phase-in for underfunded districts
 - 3% minimum increase
 - \$250 million community schools set-aside remains



Recover from COVID School Program (RECOVS)

- \$100 million for 2022-23 & 2023-24
- Support student wellbeing and learning loss
- Prioritize the highest need students and schools
- Match federal funds being utilized for these purposes



Building a Better Future

- Update Financial Aid formula
- Universal free school meals
- Increase aidable cap for BOCES Career and Technical Education teacher salaries
- Address unintended consequences of the Property Tax Cap
- Raise the fund balance limit for school districts
- Expand efforts to address staff shortages
- Reduce carbon footprint



ConnectALL Initiative

- \$1 billion investment in broadband infrastructure, access and affordability
- Removes fees for right-of-way access

 Not included: Increase of high speed broadband to 100/100 Mbps



Other Priorities

- Expanding Child Safety Zones
- More flexibility in utilizing virtual open meetings
- Allow for districts and BOCES to establish regional high schools
- Allow for flexibility in school year and school day if needed
- Legislative action to allow for alternative election arrangements if needed
